"Don't You Know There's A War On?" It was a common phrase that children heard during WWII. In this program, students will explore the ways young Americans did their part during the war by shopping with ration books, examining propaganda posters, and learning about Victory Gardens. A great age-appropriate introduction to WWII.



A LOOONG WAY FROM HOME Middle School

Wanna know why they called it a "world" war? Students will learn all about the vast distances traveled by Americans during the war using latitude and longitude, scale of miles, photograph analysis, and even a secret code to pinpoint important WWII locations on our six-foot inflatable Earth ball. Then they'll build their own WWII sign post that puts your school in the center of it all.
