## Knit Your Bit Chevron Scarf Pattern CROCHET

**Materials:** I hook, worsted weight acrylic yarn in 2 colors - Color A will be your main color, the one that will appear in the largest section.

Abbreviations: ch – chain sc – single crochet

## With Color A, chain (ch) 40.

Row 1 (right side – beginning strand will be on your left):

Work 1 sc in the second ch from the hook, 1 sc in each of the next 4 ch, 3 sc in the next ch and 1 sc in each of the next 5 ch; draw up a loop in the next ch, skip the next ch and draw up a loop in the next ch, then wrap the yarn over the hook and draw it through all 3 loops on the hook. Work 1 sc in each of the next 5 ch, 3 sc in the next chain, and 1 sc in each of the next 5 ch; draw up a loop in the next ch and draw up a loop in the next ch, then wrap the yarn over the hook and draw it through all 3 loops on the hook. Work 1 sc in each of the next ch, skip the next ch and draw up a loop in the next ch, then wrap the yarn over the hook and draw it through all 3 loops on the hook. Work 1 sc in each of the next 5 ch, 3 sc in the next ch, and 1 sc in each of the last 5 ch. (3 "hills" in row) (Note your 3sc hill will be placed in the center stitch of the hill on the previous row)



Row 2: Ch 1, turn. Draw up a loop in each of the first 2 stitches, then wrap the yarn over the hook and draw it through all 3 loops on the hook. Work 1 sc in each of the

next 4 sc, 3 sc in the next sc, and 1 sc in each of the next 5 sc; draw up a loop in the next sc, skip the next sc and draw up a loop in the next sc, then wrap the yarn over the hook and draw it through all 3 loops on the hook. Work 1 sc in each of the next 5 sc, 3 sc in the next sc, and 1 sc in each of the next 5 sc; draw up a loop in the next sc, skip the next sc, and draw up a loop in the next sc, skip the next sc, and draw up a loop in the next sc, skip the next sc, and draw up a loop in the next sc, skip the next sc, and draw up a loop in the next sc, then wrap the yarn over the hook and draw it through all 3 loops on the hook. Work 1 sc in each of the next 5 sc, 3 sc in the next sc, and 1 sc in each of the next 4 sc; draw up a loop in each of the last 2 sc, wrap the yarn over the hook and draw it through all 3 loops on the hook.

Row 3: Repeat Row 2 for Ripple Pattern until your piece measures 5" from the beginning, measured along left or ride side of work. Your last row should be a wrong side row (beginning strand will be on your right). Change to Color B.

With Color B repeat Row 2 for 4 rows. Change to Color A

With Color A repeat Row 2 for 4 rows. Change to Color B

With Color B repeat Row 2 for 4 rows. Change to Color A

With Color A repeat Row 2 until piece measures 48" from the top. Your last row should be a wrong side row. Change to Color B.

With Color B, repeat Row 2 for 4 rows. Change to Color A.

With Color A, repeat Row 2 for 4 rows. Change to Color B.

With Color B, repeat Row 2 for 4 rows. Change to Color A.

With Color A, repeat Row 2 for 4 rows.

Fasten off.

The colors are merely suggestions, use what you like, just make sure it's something a veteran would enjoy wearing!
