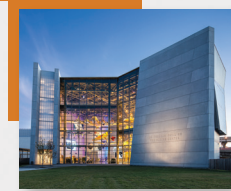
CAMPAIGNS OF COURAGE: EUROPEAN AND PACIFIC THEATERS
